WHAT IS ISFR?

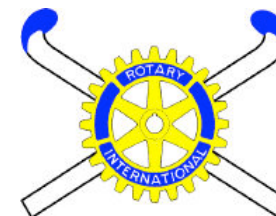


Rotary International Fellowships are defined as autonomous, international groups of Rotarians, Rotarian partners, and Rotaractors who join together to:

ISFR HISTORY

The first ISFR ski week was held in Vail, Colorado, in February of 1974. Current membership varies between 250 and 300 with annual ski event participation about 50% of the total membership.

Currently, member countries represented include: Australia, Austria, Canada, Belgium, Chile, Denmark, France, Italy, Germany, Japan, Norway, Poland, Slovakia, Surinam, Sweden, Switzerland, The Netherlands, Turkey, United Kingdom, USA and the USSR. A European Chapter plans ski weeks in Europe.

Ski weeks are organized in partnership with local Rotary clubs in ski resort communities. Local Rotary members provide expertise in planning and organizing the week of events for both skiers and non-skiing partners, including mountain tours, races, home-hosted dinners, après ski activities and tours of interesting local and historical sites.

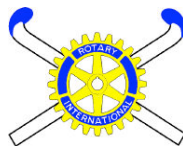

ADAPTIVE SKI PROGRAM

In 1997 the ISFR Board of Directors created the Davis Boyd Memorial Foundation (DBMF) with the objective of raising funds to support local adaptive ski programs and provide scholarships for training adaptive ski instructors.

Established following the passing of ISFR co-founder Davis Boyd, and in recognition of his life long devotion to Rotary's ideals, the DBMF raises funds through ticket raffles, live and silent auctions and other on-mountain events in partnership with local Rotary clubs. The week's fund raising activities support the local adaptive ski programs for the disabled or help initiate programs where none exist. Since its inception, the DBMF has helped establish and provide support for dozens of adaptive ski programs across North America.

In 1999 the DBMF was registered as a charitable foundation (501c3) and continues to operate with a separate Board of Directors independent of the ISFR as required by Rotary International.
