Do it now ... and get ready for a great Canadian Welcome from our hosting Revelstoke Rotarians!

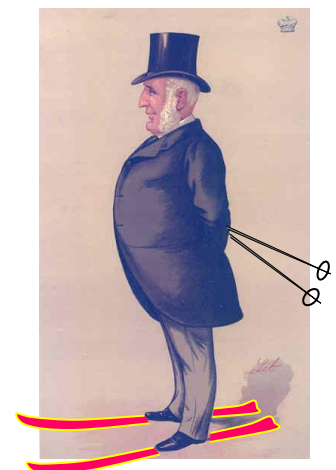

Our Resident Historian David Malaher Writes:

Did you know?

"Revelstoke" is an old-English term, probably from about the time of William the Conqueror around 1066. The two words Revel and Stoke are combined to give then name of a hamlet or small place to live.

Stoke is a very common English place name that originally means a safe location where there are walls and guards to ensure that robbers cannot get in.



The word "stockade" means the same thing; such as the walls around a western trading post.

Revel is the good news, literally. Revel means, "have a good time", as in "the revelers were still at the party as dawn broke next morning!"

Lord Revelstoke, after whom the town in British Columbia is named, put up a huge amount of money in 1885 to ensure the railroad would be completed as planned. His country estate in Devon, England, was called Revelstoke. What better name could welcome us to our ski week?

SESTRIERE, ITALY, FEBRUARY 25 to MARCH 3

OVER 100 REGISTRATIONS TO SESTRIERE SKI CHAMPIONSHIPS

The date of the opening ceremony is several months away but interest is high with registrations already exceeding 100. At this point members from Canada, Russia, Australia, Hong Kong, Turkey, Germany, France, Norway and, Italy have registered.

Site of the 2006 Winter Olympics, Sestriere will feature the usual downhill ski, cross country and slalom races but also snowboarding and three "unofficial" giant slalom competitions. Activities for non-skiers include guided tours of the jewels of Turin.

Proceeds of the event will support two non-profit organizations, Paideia, Freewhite and the International Federation for Paralimpis Skiers (FISIOP).

Sponsors, Fondazione CRT, Reale Mutua Assicurazioni, Novi cioccolato, Bene Banca, Intercostruzioni plus contributions from participants will be used to

purchase ski equipment for the disabled enabling them to enjoy winter sports. The Sestriere event, fully in the spirit of ISFR, will bring together many friends from around the world who share the passion of winter sports and the Rotary spirit of "Service Above Self."
